

# Understanding Bossier Parish School Millage


**VOTE: May 4, 2019** 

A resolution calling for a special election for the purpose of levying 22.94 mills for the purpose of **funding pay raises of \$3,000 for support personnel, \$7,200 for professional personnel**, and 3.22 mills to fund the enhancement of our technology infrastructure.



## **Bossier Compared to Surrounding Parishes**

- Despite having the highest median income, Bossier is #45 in the state for teacher pay and surrounded by school districts listed in the top ten (including Desoto, Red River and Webster).
- Average income in Bossier is \$10,000 above state average, but the Bossier teacher salary schedule is at the bottom compared to other local districts.



### Teachers and Support Employees in Bossier Schools

- Pay is the number one issue facing our schools, according to Bossier teachers.
- 76% of Bossier teachers have considered leaving the profession due to low pay. In surrounding Red River and Desoto parishes that number is more than 20% less.
- Talented teachers and school staff are taking higher paid jobs in surrounding parishes.
- Bossier Parish had 200 open positions at the beginning of the year.
- Studies show there is a direct correlation between teacher retention and academic achievement,



#### **Bossier's Future**

- Bossier Parish is the second fastest growing parish in the state with the median age at 32: more than ever, young families have children in Bossier schools, and in surrounding Red River and Desoto parishes.
- Bossier recently moved from an "A" level to a "B" level rating based on a formula change, but in order to continue being one of the best school districts in the area, we need competitive salaries and modern technology in the classroom.
- We've had state teachers of the year, state students of the year, and state principals of the year, but continue to underpay our school employees.
- Bossier's economy is increasingly technology driven, but our schools lack a sustained source of revenue to address its crumbling infrastructure and introduce emerging technologies.



Bossier can not expect to continue to have a great school district if talented educators are moving to higher paying school districts.

| Teacher – 5 years | \$44, 946      | \$52, 146                        | 16%              |
| Teacher- 10 years | \$47, 419      | \$54, 619                        | 16%              |
| Paraprofessional  | \$20, 086      | \$23, 086                        | 15%              |
| Bus Driver        | \$20, 298      | \$ 23, 298                       | 15%              |
| Food Service      | \$16, 494      | \$19, 494                        | 18%              |
| Custodian         | \$22, 831      | \$25, 831                        | 13%              |
| Clerical          | \$16,920       | \$19, 920                        | 18%              |

#### Bossier Pay Raise vs. State Wide Pay Raises

- Louisiana teachers currently make **\$2,200 below the Southern Regional Average** (and 9,860 below the national average).
- Governor Edwards wants to raise salaries for teachers and support staff to meet that regional average, beginning with a \$1000 increase for teachers and a \$500 increase for support employees to be included in the 2019-2020 state budget.
- Louisiana expects ~\$130 million surplus in state funds this fiscal year, which will more than pay for the raises in next year's budget.





#### Bossier Pay Raise vs. State Wide Pay Raises

- The state wide pay increase does alleviate some of the burden on our teachers and school employees, but without a Bossier-specific raise, we will continue to lose talented educators to surrounding parishes.
- The state wide raises will have no anticipated impact on our tax rate.
- Across the country, more people are getting an advanced education, but fewer students are perusing Master's Degrees in education:
  - In Louisiana the number of students finishing teacher preparation programs has dropped 18% since the 2010-11 school year.
